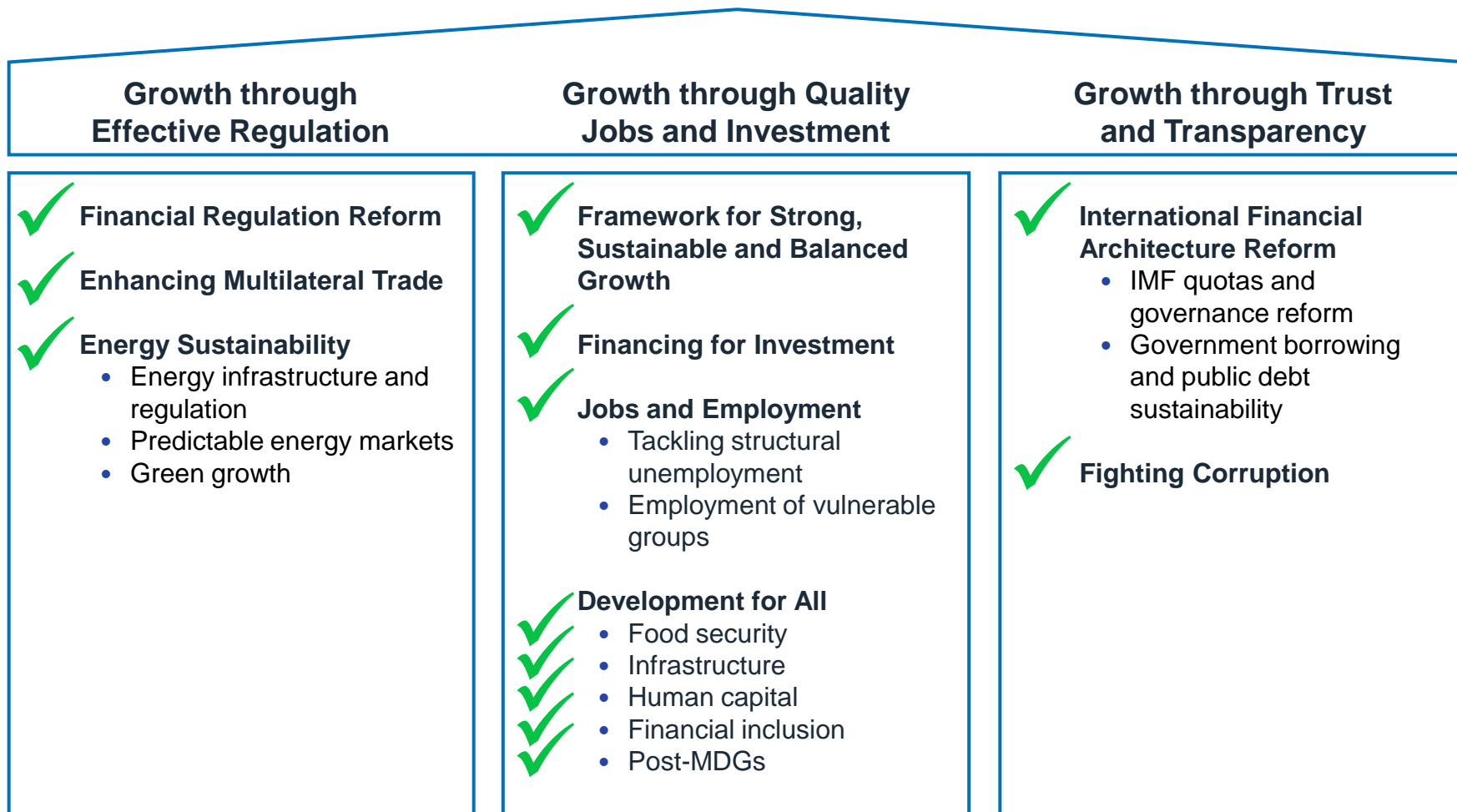
B20 Russia 2013 was based on a rich legacy of the previous years

- 5 Job Creation, Employment & Investments in Human Capital
- 6 Transparency and Anti-corruption
- 7 G20-B20 Dialogue Efficiency



We believe our recommendations fully reflect the priorities of the Russian Presidency in G20



✓ Reflected in B20 recommendations 2013

We built on the previous experience and advanced core B20 principles



Transparency – open process with full visibility of work over the comprehensive web-site with the content coverage in English



Collaborative approach – early release of the first draft of the Green book (April), incorporation of first feedback (June), preparation of the final White book (July) following open discussion at the B20 Summit



Inclusiveness – running the B20 Summit well ahead of the G20 one as part of the largest business forum – SPIEF

Structured dialogue with G20 – engagement with the Working Groups and Sherpas across the preparatory period



Continuity and consistency – through a specially created task force "G20-B20 Dialogue Efficiency" to ensure cross-consistency of final recommendations and effective delivery to the G20

Dialogue Efficiency Task Force

Achievements of the task force in 2013

- A comprehensive review and a **catalogue of all B20 recommendations** since Toronto (March 2013)
- The first in the history of B20 **report on G20 members' compliance with B20 related commitments** (presented today)
- Start of developing a draft **B20 Mid-Term Strategy** (work in progress)

Key recommendations

- **B20 Actions:** Agree on a **mid-term strategy** to ensure continuity and consistency between B20 presidencies' agendas and their alignment with B20 core long-term priorities
- **G20 Actions:** Invite the B20 for a structured dialogue within the G20 formal mechanisms, including by initiating joint G20-B20 working groups
- **G20-B20 Actions:** Develop and implement an effective and feasible coordination mechanism by 2015

G20 compliance with B20 related commitments

- At the Los Cabos summit the G20 Leaders made **180 commitments**
- At least **23 were B20 related**
- G20 also remitted **10 B20 related mandates** to other institutions
- **Eight commitments** were selected for monitoring
- The average G20 members compliance performance with B20 related commitments is **61%**

The final set of recommendations "White book" will be released by mid July 2013
